
↑ CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION:

- L: In the name of the Father and of the **†** Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- L: Our help is in the name of the Lord,
- C: who made heaven and earth.
- L: If You, O Lord, kept a record of sins, O Lord who could stand?
- C: But with You there is forgiveness; therefore, You are feared.

- C: Not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death.
- L: Why did Jesus buy you back?
- C: That I may be His own, live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness.
- L: What makes you certain of such things?
- C: He is risen from the dead, and lives and reigns to all eternity.

SERMON: "Two Lost Sons; One Loving Father" Luke 15:11-32 NET

¹¹ Then Jesus said: "A man had two sons.
¹² The younger of them said to his father,
'Father, give me my share of the property.' So he divided his property between them.

¹³ "After a few days the younger son gathered everything together, left home for a distant country, and there squandered all he had in wild living. ¹⁴ When he had spent it all, a severe famine came over that country, and he started to be in need. ¹⁵ He went and attached himself to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed hogs. ¹⁶ And he would have been glad to fill up on the pods that the hogs were eating, but no one would give him any.

¹⁷ "When he came to his senses, he said, "How many of my father's hired men have more food than they can eat, and here I am starving to death. ¹⁸ I shall get up and go to my father and tell him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. ¹⁹ I do not deserve to be called your son anymore. Make me one of your hired men."

²⁰ "So he got up and went to his father. While he was still far away, his father saw him and felt sorry for him. He ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. ²¹ 'Father,' the son told him, 'I have sinned against heaven and against you. I do not deserve to be called your son anymore.'

²² "The father told his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe--the best--and put it on him and put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. ²³ And bring the fattened calf, kill it, and let's eat and begin to celebrate. ²⁴ For this son of mine was dead and has come to life again. He was lost and has been found.' And they began to celebrate.

²⁵ "Now, his older son was out in the field. As he was coming in and approaching the house--he heard music and dancing! ²⁶ After he called one of the servants, he asked what was going on.

²⁷ "Your brother has come home,' he was told, 'and your father has killed the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.'

²⁸ "Then he became angry and would not go in. So his father came out and begged him. ²⁹ But he answered his father, 'All these years I've been working like a slave for you and have never disobeyed a command of yours, but you never gave me even a little goat to celebrate with my friends. ³⁰ But as soon as this son of yours came back, who devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him.'

31 "'Son,' the father said to him, 'you are always with me, and everything I have is yours.
32 But we had to celebrate and be glad. This brother of yours was dead and has come to life. He was lost and has been found."

↑ SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR (Martin Luther's First

and Second Questions and Answers):

- L: What is the Sacrament of the Altar?
- C: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink.
- L: What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?
- C: These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

PRAYER FOR RIGHT RECEPTION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER (LSB Service Builder):
