Luke 12:22-34 ESV

Where Is YOUR Treasur

Sunday, August 7 at 8:00 & 10:45 + Monday, August 8 at 7 12th Sunday after Pentecost / 11th Sunday after Trinity – 2016

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Think about your blessings; some are <u>for now</u> – like your car and money, and some are <u>forever</u> – like forgiveness and peace.

- Which category is MORE important to YOU?
- How does YOUR ANSWER show in YOUR LIFE (we know that actions speak louder than words)?

This sermon will focus on →our Heavenly Father providing all of our needs, →our freedom from all anxiety, and →Jesus' challenge to us to treasure what lasts forever!

- 1. THINK about the Source of Life, Food, Body, Clothes:

 22 And [Jesus] said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell
 you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will
 eat, nor about your body, what you will put on. 23 For
 [the] life is more than [the] food, and the body more
 than [the] clothing." // Since God has freely given us
 our lives and bodies, He will also freely give us *food to
 nourish our lives and *clothes to cover our bodies!
- 2. THINK about God's Provision for the Birds:

 24 "Consider the ravens [among the smartest of all birds, and have a wingspan of nearly 4 feet¹]: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet

God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! [Literally, How much rather you differ...]" // God made the ravens on day 5, the people on day 6, but people are the highpoint of His creation! As He provides for the ravens, He will certainly provide for us!

- 3. THINK Anxiety has No Power for Good: 25 "And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? [Literally, can add a cubit to his stature...²] 26 If then you are not able to do as small a thing as that, why are you anxious about the rest?" // We are familiar with the above translation adding length to life, but the literal translation is adding length to our physical height. Healthy eating and exercising could add length to life, but there is NOTHING we can do to ADD LENGTH TO OUR PHYSICAL HEIGHT. Since anxiety cannot accomplish that, we should also conclude that anxiety cannot accomplish anything good!
- 4. THINK about the Beauty of Lilies: ²⁷ "Consider [literally, observe] the lilies, how they grow [watch them]: they neither toil [work] nor spin [move], yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. ²⁸ But if God so clothes the grass, which is alive in the field today, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you, O you of little faith!" // So the lilies just stand there doing nothing, and yet they have beautiful clothing! As God clothes them, so He will certainly clothe all the people who are holy in His sight through Jesus!

- 5. THINK Your Father in Heaven will Provide: ²⁹ "And do not seek what you are to eat and what you are to drink, nor be worried. ³⁰ For all the nations of the world seek after these things [food and clothing], and your Father knows that you need them. ³¹ [But you] seek his kingdom, and these things will be added to you."
 - a. <u>The average unbeliever</u>: He lives with constant worries: ♦how will I pay for what I have bought,
 ♦how can I get even more, and ♦what will happen if I lose my job?
 - b. The one who believes in Jesus: He knows God will provide whatever he needs, so His focus is on ©knowing God, ©growing in God's Word, and ©honoring Jesus as Lord of his life!
- 6. THINK then be Faithful: 32 "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom [it's His gift to us through Jesus! Since we have the kingdom, as well as the promise of all that we need, such as food and clothes, we can be faithful!]. 33 Sell your possessions, and give to the needy. Provide yourselves with moneybags that do not grow old, with a treasure in the heavens that does not fail, where no thief approaches and no moth destroys. 34 For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."
 - a. <u>What</u> is your treasure? Temporal possessions like food and clothes, or eternal possessions like the Bible and faith in Jesus!
 - b. Who owns your heart? The god of this temporary world or the God who died for you?

- i. Those who are dominated by the god of this world are ₱worried about their earthly stuff and ₱hoping to earn heaven with their words and deeds.
- ii. Those who know Jesus are confident that ©God will provide their earthly stuff and ©heaven is open to them through Jesus!
- c. <u>Jesus challenge to believers</u>: Since we know God will provide whatever we need, Jesus challenges us to demonstrate our trust in Him by giving generously to the needy!
 - i. <u>Dr. Kretzmann noted this benefit</u>: "Then their hearts will be torn loose from all earthy considerations and will be fixed all the more easily and firmly on eternal riches" (NT 1:336). In other words, we will no longer be distracted by earthly things, freeing us to focus on heavenly things!
 - ii. <u>Jesus noted these benefits</u>: Our treasure does not grow old *like a computer*, does not fail *like an old appliance*, and cannot be stolen *like a car!*

Conclusion: Let us pray: Father in heaven, You have made us Your very own through Jesus and provide us with all that we need; thank YOU! Now, move us by Your Spirit to take Jesus' challenge by

dispersing what we have to those in need and
treasuring the things that last forever!
