Luke 2:21 and Other Passages

What's So Special about the Name of Jesus?

Introduction: Dear friends in Jesus, the Christ of Christmas:

Now we live on earth, but heaven is our goal. Even though we have heard about some of the many ways to heaven — such as *being good, *helping others, *giving money, and *going to church, we are so blessed to know this precious truth from God's Word: Even though our sins have condemned us, Jesus' living and dying have saved us!

This sermon includes ⇒Jesus' circumcision, ⇒Jesus' naming, and ⇒some of Jesus other many names. As we <u>leave 2016</u> behind and <u>begin 2017</u>, may today's focus on Jesus fill us with peace, ♦assurance, ♦gratitude, and ♦purpose!

Today's text: ESV Luke 2:21 "And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb."

- 1. Circumcision: "...God said to Abraham... 'Every male among you shall be circumcised.... it shall be a sign of the covenant [the unbreakable promise] between me and you. He who is eight days old among you shall be circumcised" (Gen. 17:9-12 ESV).
 - a. <u>If you dare, think about that sign</u>: Males had multiple daily reminders, even husbands and wives had many reminders about the Promised

Messiah! Then the Son of God was "born under the law" (Gal. 4:4 ESV), so Joseph and Mary, being faithful OT believers, had the Babe of Bethlehem circumcised on the eighth day.

- b. Think about all the blood pointing to the cross: The first drop came from the animals God killed to make the clothes for Adam and Eve (Gen. 3); rivers of blood came from all of the Passover lambs; and holy blood from Jesus' circumcision!
- c. Some thoughts on 6, 7, and 8:
 - i. The Son of God created in 6 days (Su Fr);
 Palm Sunday to Good Friday is 6 days;
 Jesus was on His cross for 6 hours, 9 to 3.
 - ii. As the Son of God rested from creating on day 7, so He rested in the tomb on day 7.
 - iii. As there were 8 persons on the ark, so circumcision was commanded on day 8 and Jesus rose on day 8. Now, by God's grace, we are baptized into Christ, thus *forgiven, *alive, and *united to Him!
- 2. Name: Even though most parents wrestle with what name to give, Joseph and Mary were in complete agreement. Since God the Father had communicated to both of them (Luke 1:31; Matt. 1:21) through an angel to name Him Jesus, His name was Jesus, which means "the Lord saves" (Explanation of the Small Catechism, 120). Jesus came to save / rescue / deliver us from our sins! Christ (Messiah in Hebrew) is Jesus' title, not His name; it means the Anointed. When Jesus was baptized, He was anointed by the Holy Spirit to be our Savior!

- a. <u>The OT Joshua</u>: His name in Hebrew is *Yeshua*. He took over for Moses, and <u>was used by the</u> <u>LORD to lead the people into the Promised Land!</u>
- b. The NT Joshua: I'm talking about Jesus! His name in Hebrew is also Yeshua; Hebrew is the language of the OT, while Greek is the language of the NT. Jesus in Greek is lesous; He was used by the LORD to open the way to the Ultimate Promised Land, thus to heaven!
- 3. Some Other Names: Our Savior is referred to by many names; those names tell us who He is and what He would do / has done to greatly bless us!
 - a. NAS Isaiah 7:14 "...a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel." // That means God with us! Wow, what an *awesome, *kind, and *loving God we have; He not only came among us, but He became like us in order to eternally save us!
 - b. NAS Isaiah 9:6 "...His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace." // Those are four compound names, with each including a divine and a human characteristic:

<u>Divine</u>	<u>Human</u>
Wonderful	Counselor
God	Hero
<u>Human</u>	<u>Divine</u>
Father	Forever
Prince of	Peace

- c. NAS Luke 1:78 "Because of the tender mercy of our God... the Sunrise from on high shall visit us..." // Think about darkness; then the importance of the sunrise; here the Son of God will come like a spiritual sunrise to shine on those in the darkness of eternal death in order to give them the gift of eternal life!
- d. NAS Luke 2:25 "...Simeon... was righteous and devout, looking for the consolation of Israel..." // Thus the comfort of Israel! They were sinners, and for those who knew it, they needed the Promised Messiah to save them, comfort them. Even now, by God's work through His Word, let us be sorry; then let us be comforted through Jesus!

Conclusion: Through knowing Jesus, let us be at peace — our sins are forgiven; let us be sure of heaven — Jesus' finished work has opened the door; let us be filled with gratitude — our heavenly Father will supply us with all that we need; and let us go forward in obedience to God's Word — confident that His ways are always best!

<u>Let us pray</u>: Dear Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, help us to leave 2016 with peace and faithfully proceed through 2017 with <u>our eyes</u> seeing Your Word, <u>our hearts</u> trusting Your promises, and <u>our actions</u> bringing Your glory!
