LORD'S SUPPER PREPARATION:

Self-Examination Questions:

- 1. Have I been baptized into Christ? "...all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27).
- 2. Am I sorry for my sins? "Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation" (2 Cor. 7:10).
- 3. Do I believe in Jesus as my Savior? "...whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
- 4. Do I desire to follow God's Word? "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105).
- 5. Do I believe I will receive bread and Body, wine and Blood, for the forgiveness of my

sins? "Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? (1 Cor. 10:16).

Who Can Receive Today? Those who answered "ves" to the five questions noted above. For others who want to receive, talk to the pastor.

- L: In the name of the Father and of the **†** Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- L: Almighty God, merciful Father, we know the devil wanted Eve to *doubt Your Word* when he asked her this question:
- C: "Did God <u>actually</u> say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?"
- L: Then, when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate.
- C: Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked.
- L: Dear Father, we have also sinned by doubting Your Word, and going against You in thought, word, and deed, so we pray:
- A: Almighty God, ⇒have mercy upon us, ⇒forgive us our sins, and ⇒lead us to everlasting life. Amen.
- L: The LORD told the devil of his future defeat with these words: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel." And now, since the Son of God has won the victory over sin, death, and the devil, and on the basis of your confession, I announce God's forgiveness to you, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

L: When the people of Israel, the descendants of Jacob, were being held captive, the LORD came to their rescue; so Pharaohsummoned Moses and Aaron by night and said, "Up, go out from among my people, both you and the people of Israel; and go, serve the LORD, as you have said. Take your flocks and your herds, as you have said, and be gone, and bless me also!" The Egyptians were urgent with the people to send them out of the land in haste. For they said, "We shall all be dead" (Exodus 12:31-33 ESV).

OLD TESTAMENT: 2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16 ESV

- L: David wanted to build a temple for the LORD:
- ¹ Now when the king lived in his house and the LORD had given him rest from all his surrounding enemies, ² the king said to Nathan

the prophet, "See now, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of God dwells in a tent."

And Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that is in your heart, for the LORD is with you."

- L: In this next part: "The Lord tells David and Nathan not what they will do but what He will do and make for David—an everlasting house and kingdom" (TLSB).
- ⁴ But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan, 5 "Go and tell my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD: Would you build me a house to dwell in? 6 I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent for my dwelling. ⁷ In all places where I have moved with all the people of Israel, did I speak a word with any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have vou not built me a house of cedar?" 8 Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. ⁹ And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. ¹⁰ And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may dwell in their own place and be disturbed no more. And violent men shall afflict them no more, as formerly, 11 from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel. And I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house....

¹⁶ And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever.'"

- L: The Word of the LORD.
- C: Thanks be to God!

L: "In all we do for the Lord, we must first consult His Word to find out what is pleasing to Him. Jesus Christ is the 'rest' and 'house' promised to David. In Him, God's people have rest from their enemies of sin and death, and in Him they shall dwell forever" (TLSB).

HYMN: LSB 357, st. 3

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

3 O come, O come, Thou Lord of might, Who to Thy tribes on Sinai's height In ancient times didst give the Law In cloud and majesty and awe. Refrain

Refrain: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel!

L: This prophecy points to the conception of Jesus, that *God would come to be with us* through the womb of a virgin: Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, "Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test." And he said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:10-14 ESV).

HYMN: LSB 357, st. 4

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

4 O come, Thou Branch of Jesse's tree, Free them from Satan's tyranny That trust Thy mighty pow'r to save, And give them vict'ry o'er the grave. **Refrain**

Refrain: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel!

L: This is a powerful prophecy about the Messiah who came, our Lord Jesus Christ:

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins (Isaiah 11:1-5 ESV).

5 O come, Thou Key of David, come, And open wide our heav'nly home; Make safe the way that leads on high, And close the path to misery. Refrain

Refrain: Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel Shall come to thee, O Israel!

HOLY GOSPEL: Luke 1:26-38 ESV

- L: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the first chapter.
- C: Glory to You, O LORD.
- L: "The angel Gabriel announces Jesus' birth to Mary, who responds in faith" (TLSB).

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, <u>O favored one</u>, the Lord is with you!" ²⁹ But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be.

³⁰ And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for <u>you have found favor with God</u>. ³¹ And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, ³³ and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

L: Mary was favored by God, not because of a special quality in her, but because He loved her and chose her to be the one through whom His Son would come into the world.

³⁴ And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

35 And the angel answered her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy-- the Son of God. 36 And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. 37 For nothing will be impossible with God." 38 And Mary said, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her.

L: The Gospel of the Lord.

L: Mary did not doubt but wondered how, so Gabriel told her. He also offered her proof by telling her about Elizabeth being pregnant in her old age. Let us also be certain that nothing is impossible with God!

EPISTLE: Romans 16:25-27 ESV

L: "Paul's closing words [in his letter to the Christians in Rome] encompass the entire good news of God, from the prophetic OT writings to the proclamation of Jesus Christ being made known to all nations. God's eternal being, His wisdom, knowledge, and power, are all far beyond ours. He calls those of faith to respond in obedience to His will" (TLSB).

²⁵ Now to him who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages ²⁶ but has now been disclosed and through the prophetic writings has been made known to all nations, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith-- ²⁷ to the only wise God be glory forevermore through Jesus Christ! Amen.

L: The Word of the LORD.

C: Thanks be to God!
