



It forms the mainstream definition of Christianity for most Christians. It is called Nicene because, in its original form, it was adopted in the city of Nicaea (present day Iznik in Turkey) by the first ecumenical council, which met there in the year 325 (Wikipedia).

Therefore with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising You and singing:

GOD IS HOLY ("Sanctus" in Latin) ("Hosanna" – save us now) (Is. 6:1-3; Mt. 21:9) (LSB 195) (<u>sung by all</u>): As Jesus was welcomed on Palm Sunday as the Holy Son of God, so we welcome His presence in the Supper!

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Sabaoth [angelic armies]; Heav'n and earth are full of Thy glory; Hosanna, Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is He, Blessed is He, Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.
