## **God With Us**

A Chronology of the Four Gospels Regarding Our Savior's Birth!

Part 5:



<u>Luke 1:39-45</u> – Mary Visits Elizabeth, and Both are Expecting! <u>Luke 1:46-56</u> – Mary, Pregnant with Jesus, Magnifies the Lord! Join Us: Christmas Eve at 6 PM; Christmas Day at 10 AM

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This is part 5 of "God With Us"! In part 4 an angel visited Mary to tell her about the child she would bear; we also traced the genealogy of Jesus – on Mary's side – all the way back to Adam; therefore, Jesus is the one Savior for all people of all time (Acts 4:12)!

Notice the number **5** on <u>our timeline</u>; that is our focus today: *Mary visiting Elizabeth!* The length of the visit was *about three months*; today's text covers •Mary's journey to Elizabeth and •the statements they made to each other when she arrived.

## 1. Mary Visits Elizabeth, and Both are Expecting:

a. NIV Luke 1:39 At that time Mary got ready [At what time? Right after she humbly agreed to bear our Savior!] and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea,

40 where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. [Mary lived in Nazareth of Galilee, while Elizabeth lived in Judea – near Jerusalem. Mary traveled about 80 miles one way, and she "hurried" – anxious to verify what the angel had told her!] 41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit.

// Even though Mary had been informed about Elizabeth, we are not aware that Elizabeth had been informed about Mary. Therefore, God used the sound of Mary's voice to cause \*the preborn John to leap and \*Elizabeth to be filled with the Holy Spirit!

Then, *upon being filled*, the Bible records this about Elizabeth:

- b. <sup>42</sup> In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! <sup>43</sup> But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? <sup>44</sup> As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. <sup>45</sup> Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!" // Yes, truly Mary is blessed among women, but why?
  - i. <u>Because</u> God chose Mary above every other woman to be the one through whom He would bring His Son, the promised Savior, into the world!
  - ii. <u>Because</u> she believed what the Lord told her, through Gabriel, that she would bear the "the Son of the Most High." (Luke 1:32 ESV)
  - iii. <u>Because</u> she *humbly* and *willingly* accepted God's will for her life! Think about Mary: Her part included ◆much faith, ◆much joy, and ◆much sorrow yet she honored the Lord by doing His will; may we do the same!
- 2. Mary, Pregnant with Jesus, Magnifies the Lord: Right after Elizabeth spoke of the blessings which had been showered upon Mary, the Bible records Mary's response:
  - a. NIV Luke 1:46 And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord 47 and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, 48 for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant. From now on all generations will call me blessed, 49 for the Mighty One has done great things for me-- holy is his name. 50 His mercy

extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation." // Let's take a closer look:

- i. Mary rejoiced in God her Savior. We all need Jesus; He is the one Savior for all people of all time (John 14:6; Acts 4:12)! The song, "Mary Did You Know," includes this phrase: "Did you know that your baby boy has come to make you new, this child that you delivered will soon deliver you?" (Mary Lowry, Buddy Greene, 1991)
- ii. Mary lived the words of Micah 6:8 by ◆doing justice, ◆loving kindness, and ◆walking humbly with her God; may we do the same unto God's glory!
- iii. Now, as we look back to Mary's faith, courage, and faithfulness, we call her blessed because she willingly ◆bore, ◆nourished, ◆nurtured, and ◆loved her Son—the Savior of the whole world! Therefore, as Mary feared, thus trusted, in the Almighty God, let us gladly do the same! Mary continued with these words:
- b. <sup>51</sup> "He [the Mighty One] has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts. <sup>52</sup> He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble. <sup>53</sup> He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty. <sup>54</sup> He has helped his servant Israel, remembering to be merciful <sup>55</sup> to Abraham and his descendants forever, even as he said to our fathers." // Mary gave all the *credit* and all the *glory* to God:
  - i. <u>He has performed mighty deeds</u> with his arm *He did it and no one else!*

- ii. ...he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts yes, he knows our inmost thoughts, so let us ◆be repentant and ◆humbly trust in the Lord!
- iii. He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble God is almighty, He can do anything; great rulers are powerless against Him, yet He lifts up and blesses the humble!
- iv. He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty – Let us ever trust in the true God, knowing that He will provide whatever we need!
- v. He has helped his servant Israel Yes, so
  Abraham had a son named Isaac, and Isaac had a
  son named Jacob whose name is also Israel. So
  the entire nation came from the body of
  Abraham. But even more important is this:
  "...those who believe [in Jesus as Savior] are
  children of Abraham." (Gal 3:7 NIV) So we, by
  grace through faith, have God's eternal blessing
  upon us!

Conclusion: <sup>56</sup> Mary stayed with Elizabeth for about three months and then returned home. // It seems that Mary left to return to Nazareth – just before Elizabeth gave birth to John. Please join us this Sunday at 8:00 or 10:45 as → John is born and named, also as → Zechariah tells in advance about Jesus and John!
