The risen Jesus appears to His disciples, eats in their presence, reminds them what has happened, reminds them they are witnesses, and tells them about being clothed with power!

- L: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-fourth chapter.

³⁶ While [the Emmaus' Road travelers] were still talking [to Jesus' disciples] about [meeting the risen Jesus], Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷ They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost.

³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me

and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." ⁴⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet.

⁴¹ And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate it in their presence.

⁴⁴ He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms." ⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.

⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised [that is, the Holy Spirit]; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

SERMON: Acts 4:1-12

NAS-95

- 1. Peter and John Lived with Courage: ¹ As they were speaking to the people [about Jesus], the priests and the captain of the temple guard and the Sadducees came up to them, ² being greatly disturbed because they were teaching the people and proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection from the dead. // Remember, on the very day that Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, the Bible says...
- 2. Peter and John were Arrested: ³ And [the Jewish leaders] laid hands on them and put

- them in jail until the next day, for it was already evening. // The Jewish leaders had...
- 3. Many Who Heard about Jesus Believed: ⁴ But many of those who had heard the message [of Peter and John] believed; and the number of the men came to be about five thousand. // A year or so earlier on the Day of Pentecost, 3,000 were added...
- 4. Another Golden Opportunity for Peter and John: ⁵ On the next day, their <u>rulers</u> and <u>elders</u> and <u>scribes</u> were gathered together in Jerusalem; ⁶ and <u>Annas</u> the high priest <u>was</u> there, and <u>Caiaphas</u> and <u>John</u> and <u>Alexander</u>, and all who were of high-priestly descent. ⁷ When they had placed them in the center, they <u>began</u> to inquire, "By what power, or in what name, have you [healed the man who was born lame]?" // Try to imagine being <u>Peter</u> or <u>John</u>...
- 5. Courage in the Face of Fierce Opposition:

 8 Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers and elders of the people,

 9 if we are on trial today for a benefit done to a sick man, as to how this man has been made well, 10 let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead—by this name this man stands here before you in good health."
 - a. <u>Filled with the Spirit</u>: What does that mean?
 - b. <u>Proclaiming Jesus</u>: The powerful leaders...
- 6. Clarifying the Greatness of Jesus:
 - a. The Chief Corner Stone: 11 "[Jesus] is the STONE WHICH WAS REJECTED by you, THE BUILDERS, but WHICH BECAME THE CHIEF CORNER stone."

b. The Only Way to be Saved: 12 And there is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved." // See the image to understand!

LORD'S SUPPER SELF-EXAMINATION:

"Let a person examine himself" (1Cor. 11:28 ESV).

Should I receive the Lord's Supper today?

- 5. Do I desire to live for Christ? Y N 2 Cor. 5:15

Part 2: Am I right with others?

- 6. Am I reconciled with others? Y N Rom. 12:18

<u>Part 3</u>: Do I believe what the Bible says about the Lord's Supper?

- 9. Is the main benefit of the Supper the assurance of the forgiveness of sins? Y N Matt. 26:26-28

↑ LUTHER'S SMALL CATECHISM:

- L: <u>Dr. Luther's third Sacrament of the Altar</u> <u>question</u>: How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?
- C: Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but the words written here: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." These words, along with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say: "forgiveness of sins."

PRAYER FOR RIGHT RECEPTION:

L: Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the solemn night of Your betrayal You established the holy meal of Your body and blood for us Christians to eat and to drink. Look in mercy on us who will receive the holy Sacrament this day. Grant that we come to Your table in true repentance and faith, that the gift of Your body and blood will sustain us in our afflictions, strengthen us in the communion of Your holy people, and be a pledge of the resurrection of our bodies to life everlasting; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
