# Week 27 Parent Sheet: Jonah and the Big Fish


Jonah Chapters 1 – 4 NIV

## The Old Testament covers approximately 4,000 years; this timeline shows some key events:





### **Previous history:**

- 1. The true account of Jonah took place in 790 BC, when Assyria was the world power and Nineveh, with a population of over 120,000, was one of its important cities.
- 2. The map above shows two possible routes for the ship Jonah was on; the route going west was mostly likely his route, *which is the opposite direction of Nineveh*.
- 3. The Assyrians were very ruthless people, similar to what we have heard about ISIS.

### Jonah and the Big Fish:

### Chapter 1:

- 1. The LORD said to go east, but he went west.
- Jonah didn't want to go to Nineveh, because he didn't want the people of Nineveh to repent; instead, he wanted the LORD to overthrow them.
- 3. When the storm at sea was raging, and Jonah knew it was because of his disobedience to the LORD, he

told the sailors to throw him into the sea; then he was swallowed by a great fish.

### Chapter 2:

- 1. While in the belly of the big fish, Jonah was sorry for disobeying the LORD.
- 2. The LORD persuaded Jonah, with his experience in the belly of the great fish, to go to Nineveh.
- 3. Jonah was willing to do the LORD's will and prayed to the LORD.

### Chapter 3:

- 1. Jonah went to Nineveh and proclaimed: "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overturned."
- 2. Those in Nineveh believed God, were sorry for their sins, and asked for forgiveness.
- 3. The LORD saw their repentance and did not bring the destruction He had threatened.

### Chapter 4:

- 1. Jonah was angry; he wanted the LORD to destroy Nineveh.
- 2. The LORD taught Jonah that He loved the people of Nineveh, *even as He loves all sinners!*

### Thoughts:

- 1. The LORD loves everyone; He wants all people to be sorry for their sins and trust in Jesus, who lived, died, and rose to take away all sins.
