## Many Events of Jesus' Life in Chronological Order:

- Born (5 BC)
- Named when 8 days old
- Presented at the Temple when 40 days old
- Visited by Wise Men when 2 to 5 months old
- Fled to Egypt when 2 to 5months old
- Returned to live in Nazareth when 1 year old
- His parents thought He was lost when 12 years old
- Baptized by John when 30 years old
- Some important events of His three-year ministry:
  - → Tempted in the wilderness
  - → Moved from Nazareth to Capernaum
  - Called His disciples
  - ➡ Preached the Sermon on the Mount
  - ➡ Performed many miracles
  - ➡ Sent out His disciples to heal and teach
  - → Warned about persecution
  - → Told many parables
  - → Heard of the death of John the Baptist

# → More miracles and teaching

- ➡ Transfigured, Moses and Elijah appeared with Him
- More miracles and teaching
- → Welcomed into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday
- → Taught many things on Holy Tuesday
- ➡ Instituted the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday.
- → Arrested, tried, crucified, and died on Good Friday
- ➡ Raised to life on the third day, Easter Sunday
- → Ascended into heaven 40 days after Easter

## **Background:**

- 1. During Jesus' life and ministry He fulfilled many OT prophecies, taught with authority, and did many mighty miracles; all such things prove that He is the Son of God, the Promised Savior of the world!
- 2. Let us see today that, from God's perspective, children are very important!

### The Lost Sheep:

- The setting: Jesus was teaching His disciples people who were ₱trusting in Him, ₱learning from Him, and ₱following Him.
- Earlier in Matthew 18: 1...the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who, then, is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" 2 He called a little child to him,

- and placed the child among them. <sup>3</sup> And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. <sup>4</sup> Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." // Think about a small child how he trusts others to be honest with him and to help him with all of his needs. Jesus is calling everyone to trust in Him, even as a little child trusts his loving parents.
- 3. Regarding little children who believe: 10 "See that you do not despise [look down on] one of these little ones. For I tell you that their angels in heaven always see the face of my Father in heaven." // Those little ones each have a guardian angel watching over them; they are not alone.
- 4. God deeply cares for His children: 12 "What do you think? If a man owns a hundred sheep, and one of them wanders away, will he not leave the ninetynine on the hills and go to look for the one that wandered off? 13 And if he finds it, truly I tell you, he is happier about that one sheep than about the ninety-nine that did not wander off. 14 In the same way your Father in heaven is not willing that any of these little ones [these children who believe] should perish. // Even though children or beginners in the faith or others in God's family may seem unimportant or feel forgotten, let us teach them that God:
  - a. Made them!
  - b. Loves them!
  - c. Saved them!
  - d. Provides for them!
  - e. Is watching over them!

### **Thoughts:**

- 1. As God values children, so let us do the same!
- 2. By nature we are *spiritually dead* and *eternally doomed*; therefore, *by God's grace and power*, let us trust in Jesus and the work He did to *live in our place* and *pay the eternal penalty for our sins!*
- 3. Let us gladly receive the benefits of Jesus' work through Word and Sacrament!
