4. Being a Stephen Minister

The nuts and bolts:

- <u>Trained to serve</u>: Since the training is thorough, each Stephen Minister is well equipped to serve.
- Serving is one-to-one: In other words, each Stephen Minister only works with one person at a time. Another caring relationship will not begin until the current caring relationship has concluded.
- Serving is once per week: That is how often a Stephen Minister meets with his/her Care Receiver. By the way: a man ministers to a man, while a woman ministers to a woman.
- Serving is 1-hour per week: We are each blessed with 168 hours each week, so 1-hour per week is minimal, yet God can work in amazing ways.
- Monthly supervision meetings: They include the Stephen Leader, Pastor, and other Stephen Ministers and result in being a great source of encouragement, continuing education, and guidance.

The joy: In the face of a seemingly impossible situation, Jesus said, "With people this is impossible, but with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26 NAS-95). Imagine how God can work through you to transform a hurting person into a happy person.

Conclusion

God has planned certain good works for each Christian: Paul wrote, "...we [believers in Jesus] are [God's] workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them" (Ephesians 2:10 NAS-95).

Now, ask yourself: Is Stephen Ministry training part of God's will for MY life?



Introduction

<u>Dear Friend</u>: Thanks for being open to the work of the Holy Spirit **in your life** and, possibly, **through your life** to others as a Stephen Minister.

Four Basic Steps

- 1. Find out more.
- 2. Receive the training.
- **3.** Prayerfully seek God's will.
- 4. Being a Stephen Minister.

Please keep reading to learn more about each of the four basic steps...

1. Find Out More

What are Stephen Ministers? They are lay congregation members trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation.

Stephen Ministers are there:

- after the funeral, when everyone has left.
- after the relationship falls apart.
- after the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there's nothing more we can do."
- after the nursing home director says, "Welcome to your new home."
- after your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk it out.

Norma Sweeny is our Stephen Ministry expert – since she has taken the Stephen Leader training course and taught through the 50-hours of Stephen Minister training multiple times. Norma would be glad to help you learn more about Stephen Ministry.

2. Receive the Training

Taking the training does not mean you are

committing to serve as a Stephen Minister: Instead, it is recommended that you first take the training for your own personal benefit – since the training touches on many important areas of life. As you learn, you will increase your knowledge and acquire skills to help you in many areas of your own life.

What is a good way to summarize the training? It is an engaging, energizing experience that features a mixture of presentation, video, group discussion, skill practice, and spiritual growth activities.

Stephen Minister training will:

- Teach you principles and skills to equip you to provide high-quality, Christ-centered emotional and spiritual care to others.
- Give you new insight into the thoughts, feelings, and actions of people who are hurting.
- Equip you with relational and caring skills you can apply to all aspects of your life.
- Help deepen your faith as the Holy Spirit fashions you into a Christcentered caregiver.
- Build a special bond of Christian community and friendship among all those in your class.

3. Prayerfully Seek God's Will

This section includes some very important things to remember and consider as you prayerfully seek God's will.

Be encouraged by this verse: "Now to <u>Him</u> [that is, God the Father] who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us [that is, God the Holy Spirit] (Ephesians 3:20 NAS-95).

Think about that verse...

- If we ask of God: "Please use me in this way," God can do that AND much more!
- If we think of something that seems impossible: God can do that AND much more!

How does God work through us?

- We are the tool: As we could use a hammer to drive a nail, so God wants to use us to help someone in need.
- God is the skillful carpenter: When we are open to His will, He can work through us in amazing ways.
- God and us: When we know what God can do and we are willing to live by faith, we can respond like Isaiah: "Then I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?' Then I said, 'Here am I. Send me!" (Isaiah 6:8 NAS-95).
