Romans 3; John 8 ESV

What Is the Reformation? Why Is It Important for YOU?

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Have you ever sat on your metal-framed glasses? If so, they became <u>deformed</u>, so you may have <u>reformed</u> them into their proper shape!

We could say that God's saving truth has a *proper* form; however, in the centuries leading up to AD 600, *God's saving truth became deformed!* As deformed glasses will not enable a person to see, so God's deformed truth will not set a person free from the condemnation of his sins!

This sermon includes ♦some church history, ♦the spiritual condition of non-believers, ♦a glimpse of Dr. Luther, and ♦salvation essentials.

1. Some Church History:

- a. Think back to AD 600: There was only ONE Christian church body, so there was only one Christian denomination in the whole world; we might call it the Holy Christian Church. However, that church body was powerless to save because she had rejected God's saving truth, which sets people free from their sins.
- b. The 1054 split: In AD 1054, the Holy Christian Church split in two thus forming the first two Christian denominations. In the west, headquartered in Rome,

they called themselves "Catholic" – meaning, the true church. In the east, headquartered in Constantinople (which is in modern-day Turkey and now called Istanbul), they called themselves "Orthodox" – meaning, the true teachings. They both chose great church body names, but NEITHER name was true! Since BOTH had a deformed version of God's saving truth, the Roman Catholics were NOT the true church, while the Eastern Orthodox did NOT have the true teachings. Both of those sad realities remain true even today: (

2. The Spiritual Condition of Non-Believers:

- a. Wounded or dead: The Catholic Church teaches that people are severely wounded, while the Orthodox Church teaches that people are derailed; therefore, they teach SOME ability: The wounded can recover and the derailed can be put back on the tracks. Those things sound good; HOWEVER, are they true? Paul reminded the Ephesians that, prior to God making them alive in Christ, they were dead in their trespasses and sins (2:1). Did you catch the HUGE difference? When people THINK they have ability, they trust in themselves; however, when people know they are dead, then, by God's grace, they trust in Jesus!
- b. Some key words of Law from Romans 3: ²⁰ For by works of the law no human being will be justified in [God's] sight... // NO ONE by whatever he does can make himself acceptable to God. Why? Because ²³ ...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God... // Furthermore, our good CANNOT cancel out our sin, so all non-believers are spiritually helpless, even dead!!

3. A Glimpse of Dr. Luther:

- a. <u>Growing up</u>: In 1483 Martin was born into a Roman Catholic family; he was active in church and excelled in his studies. As he grew up, Martin's father prospered permitting Martin to attend excellent schools!
- b. <u>Change of course</u>: As Martin drew near to graduating with a law degree... *he became seized with God's wrath toward sinners*. Therefore, at 22 years old, *attempting to win God's favor*, he dropped out of law school, gave away his possessions, and became an Augustinian monk.
- c. <u>Monk to professor</u>: At 24 years old, Martin became a priest; then he *continued* to study, *began* to teach, and *received* his doctorate in theology at the age of 28.
- d. God showed him the saving truth: At the age of 31, when Dr. Luther was studying the Bible in preparation for his teaching, God showed him that we obtain what we need for eternal life NOT by what we do, BUT by God's work in Christ which we receive through faith!

4. Salvation Essentials:

- a. Some key words of Gospel from today's readings:
 - i. John 8: ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." [What is the truth? We are totally helpless; God has done everything in Christ to save us!] ... ³⁶ So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." // Free from what? From the condemnation of our sins, which we fully deserve!
 - ii. Romans 3: ²¹ ...the righteousness of God [the very thing we desperately need] has been manifested

[revealed] apart from the law [so it's not from our keeping of the law] ... ²³ ...all... ²⁴ ...are justified by his grace [undeserved love] as a gift, through the redemption [God's action to buy us back] that is in Christ Jesus... ²⁵ ...[God] had passed over former sins. ²⁶ ...to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just [without sin] and the justifier [the remover of sins] of the one who has faith in Jesus.... ²⁸ ...we hold that one is justified [made right in God's sight] by faith apart from works of the law. // When God works through His Word to show us our helplessness, He also shows us Jesus and enables us to receive the benefits of His work!

b. By grace through faith in Jesus for eternal life:

- i. By grace: By God's undeserved love!
- ii. Through faith: Through God-given trust!
- iii. **In Jesus**: *In who He is and in what He has done!*
- iv. **For eternal life**: For the immediate forgiveness of sins and the eventual entrance into heaven!

This Week's Challenge: When it comes to eternal life, admit you are helpless; then give thanks to God for His undeserved love and His gift of eternal life through Jesus!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, TY for **+** Your love for us, **+** Your Word of Truth, **+** Jesus' finished work, **+** bold reformers like Dr. Luther, and **+** the Spirit's work to show us our helplessness, give us faith to trust in Jesus for eternal life, and keep us in Your holy family!
