

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: On this Thanksgiving Eve of 2019, let's think about ⇒Some *Thanksgiving realities* and ⇒the *topic of thanks* in tonight's Scripture readings.

The Eve of our National Day of Thanksgiving – 2019

1. Some Thanksgiving Realities:

- a. When did Thanksgiving officially begin? In 1863, that is, 156 years ago, Abraham Lincoln declared Thanksgiving to be a national holiday in America.
- b. What was going on in 1863? That was the middle of the Civil War (1861-1865), which was the deadliest conflict in the history of our nation in all of our nation's wars, roughly 1.2 million America soldiers have died, and HALF of them lost their lives in the Civil War!
- c. What is now a typical Thanksgiving Day in America? It includes such things as ▶not working, ▶not going to

school, ▶attending a parade, ▶eating turkey, ▶watching football, and ▶going shopping. According to a student at St. Louis University, Thanksgiving is about ✓ family time, ✓ confronting our history, and ✓ thankfulness; however, sadly, in her section about thankfulness, she gave this advice: "reflect on the people, places, groups, and things that you are thankful for at some point during this holiday."¹ That sounds nice, but she made no mention of thanking God, the Ultimate Giver of every good and perfect gift (James 1:17).

- d. What is the meaning of the word, thanksgiving? Google has two definitions:
 - i. The expression of gratitude, especially to God.
 - ii. An annual national holiday marked by religious observances and a traditional meal including turkey.

2. The Topic of *Thanks* in Tonight's Scripture Readings:

a. ESV Deuteronomy 8:1-10: 2 ...the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness... 3 And he... fed you with manna... 4 Your clothing did not wear out... these forty years.... 7 ...the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land... 10 ...and you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land he has given you. // The LORD had given the descendants of Abraham so much; in response, they were called to "bless the LORD," which means to "declare God the origin of power for success, prosperity, fertility" (Holladay). Let us remember what God has done and is doing, and then let us give Him thanks!

b. NAU Psalm 67:

- i. VV. 1-2: We are blessed for a purpose: God be gracious to us and bless us, And cause His face to shine upon us—Selah [pause and think]. ² That Your way may be known on the earth, Your salvation among all nations. // Those words are very similar to the common benediction; with those words we are asking God to love us even though we are undeserving by giving us what we need. Then, having what we need, we are promising to tell others what God has done: ✦loving us, ✦giving us what we need, and ✦saving us from our sins!
- ii. VV. 3-4: We praise God for His fairness: ³ Let the peoples praise You, O God; Let all the peoples praise You. ⁴ Let the nations be glad and sing for joy; For You will judge the peoples with uprightness And guide the nations on the earth.

 Selah [pause and think]. // Let's put things in perspective: God has ALL power, we have NO power; therefore, He can do anything He wants and we cannot stop Him, we are completely at His mercy. Therefore, knowing of God's perfect fairness and uprightness, we praise Him especially knowing that in Christ we are forgiven!
- iii. VV. 5-7: We praise God for our food: ⁵ Let the peoples praise You, O God; Let all the peoples praise You. ⁶ The earth has yielded its produce; God, our God, blesses us. ⁷ God blesses us, That all the ends of the earth may fear Him. // God has given us life in our bodies AND faithfully provides us with food to nourish our bodies; therefore, David

wrote these words about the LORD: "You open Your hand And satisfy the desire of every living thing" (Ps. 145:16 NAU). Therefore, at this time of Thanksgiving and at all times, let us recognize His blessings and give Him our praise and thanks!

- c. Philippians 4:6-20: Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. // Notice the key parts: Anxiety, regular prayer, fervent prayer, and thanksgiving... What an odd combination! But why? When we are anxious about anything, God invites us to give all such things to Him in prayer AND, as we are praying, to remember our blessings and give Him thanks. By doing so, we give Him our anxieties and begin to focus on our blessings!
- d. ESV Luke 17:11-19: 12 ...ten lepers... 13 ... "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." 14 ...they were cleansed. 15 Then one of them... 16 ...fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. // Think about that ratio... 10 to 1; maybe today's world has a similar ratio? God gives everyone food, clothes, and shelter, yet maybe only one out of every ten gives Him thanks. May God help us this Thanksgiving and each day going forward to be the ONE out of the TEN!

Let Us Pray: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, we are sinful and weak, yet You bless us with forgiveness, strength, and so much more! Help us to thank You now and always! Amen!
