13 "I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries and bring them to their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the streams, and in all the inhabited places of the land. ¹⁴ I will feed them in a good pasture, and their grazing ground will be on the mountain heights of Israel. ²³ "Then <u>I</u> [God the Father] will set over them one shepherd, <u>My servant David</u> [that is, the great descendant of David, the Son of God, the Promised

Messiah], and he will feed them; he will feed them himself and be their shepherd. ²⁴ And I, the LORD, will be their God, and My servant David [that is, the coming Savior] will be prince among them; I the LORD have spoken.

Right now Jesus is risen and reigning. Once He conquers all of His enemies; then God the Father will reign over all things!

²⁰ But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep.

²¹ For since by a man *came* death, by a man also came the resurrection of the dead. ²² For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ all will be made alive. ²³ But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, after that those who are Christ's at His coming, ²⁴ then *comes* the end, when He hands over the kingdom to the God and Father, when He has abolished all rule and all authority and power. 25 For He [Jesus] must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. ²⁶ The last enemy that will be abolished is death. ²⁷ For HE [that is, God the Father] HAS PUT ALL THINGS IN SUBJECTION UNDER HIS [Jesus'] FEET. ⁴¹ "Then He will also say to <u>those on His left</u> [the unbelieving, the selfish, the unrepentant], 'Depart from Me, accursed ones, into the eternal fire which has been prepared for the devil and his angels; ⁴² for I was hungry, and you gave Me nothing to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave Me nothing to drink; ⁴³ I was a stranger, and you did not invite Me in; naked, and you did not clothe Me; sick, and in prison, and you did not visit Me.""

⁴⁴ "Then they themselves also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not take care of You?'"

⁴⁵ "Then <u>He</u> [Jesus] will answer them, 'Truly I say to you, to the extent that you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me.'"

The Confusion of Languages:

1 The whole world talked one language with the same words. 2 As people traveled in the east, they found a plain in the country of Babylonia and lived there.

3 "Come," they said to one another, "let us make bricks, and let us burn them hard." They used bricks for stones and asphalt for mortar.

4 Then they said, "Come, let us build a city for ourselves and a tower with its top in the sky, and let's make ourselves famous to keep from getting scattered all over the earth."
