Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: It's been a year of opinions about what is ESSENTIAL, and what is not. Even though opinions vary greatly, receiving Jesus is MOST ESSENTIAL for everyone! Today, as we focus on the lectionary readings, let's \(\psi\) find the Christ and \(\psi\) receive Him anew!

OLD TESTAMENT: Isaiah 52:7-10 NAU POINTING AHEAD TO THE SAVIOR

The southern kingdom of Judah fell to the Babylonians around 600 BC; however, about 70 years later, the LORD restored that nation. The JOY of that restoration pointed ahead to personal restoration through the Christ!

⁷ How lovely on the mountains Are the feet of him who brings good news [good news of victory], Who announces peace And brings good news of happiness, Who announces salvation, And says to Zion, "Your God reigns [your God, thus not the enemy]!"

⁸ The voice of <u>your watchmen</u> [your prophets]--they lift up their voices [a phrase from the ESV]; They shout joyfully together; For they will see with their own eyes When the LORD restores Zion.

⁹ Break forth, shout joyfully together, You waste places of Jerusalem; For the LORD has comforted His people, He has <u>redeemed</u> [bought back] Jerusalem.

¹⁰ The LORD has bared His holy arm In the sight of all the nations [restoring Judah **and** pointing ahead to the restoring of all sinners through Jesus], That all the ends of the earth may see The salvation of our God.

PSALM: 2 ESV - BE BLESSED! TAKE REFUGE IN THE SON!

The Nations Oppose the Lord: ¹ Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain? ² The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against his Anointed, saying, ³ "Let us burst their bonds apart and cast away their cords from us."

Notes: v. 1: in vain: Without the truth or the power to reach their goal.

v. 2: His anointed: David, anointed by Samuel to be the next king.

v. 3: us: The kings who opposed David, and thought they could resist him.

The Lord Establishes His King: ⁴ He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord holds them in derision. ⁵ Then he will speak to them in his wrath, and terrify them in his fury, saying, ⁶ "As for me, I have set my King on Zion, my holy hill."

Notes: v. 4: *derision*: The Lord ridiculed them, since they could not succeed. v. 6: *my King*: The kingship of David points ahead to the much greater kingship of Jesus.

The Son's Rule: ⁷ I will tell of the decree: The LORD said to me, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you. ⁸ Ask of me, and I will make the nations your heritage, and the ends of the earth your possession. ⁹ You shall <u>break</u> them with a rod of iron and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel."

Notes: v. 9: *break*: "In Mesopotamian texts, a king's rule was often likened to the act of smashing pottery. Thus, 'break' here means to rule" (TLSB).

<u>A Warning:</u> ¹⁰ Now therefore, O kings, be wise; be warned, O rulers of the earth. ¹¹ Serve the LORD with <u>fear</u>, and <u>rejoice with trembling</u>. ¹² Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who <u>take refuge</u> in him.

Note: v. 11: *fear*: Have reverence for, and trust in the LORD. *Rejoice with trembling*: Thankful for God's forgiveness, and continued living in repentance. v. 12: *take refuge*. "To acknowledge and surrender to the one whom God, in His infinite wisdom, has chosen to rule" (TLSB).

EPISTLE: Hebrews 1:1-6 NAU – <u>JESUS IS GREAT</u>! LET US WORSHIP HIM!

Jesus' Importance: ¹ God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, ² in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things [in a figurative sense, pointing to Jesus' greatness], through whom also He made

the world [the Father created all things through the Son]. // Jesus is great: The Father spoke through Him; heir of all; and all created through Him!

<u>Jesus' Power</u>: ³ And <u>He</u> [God's Son] is the radiance of <u>His</u> [God the Father's] glory and the exact representation of <u>His nature</u> [His essence, His being], and upholds all things by the word of His power. // <u>Jesus is great</u>: He is the essence of the Father; He upholds all things!

<u>Jesus' Saving Work</u>: When <u>He</u> [Jesus] had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴ having become as much better than the angels, as He has inherited a more excellent name than they [because He is God's Son]. // Jesus fulfilled His mission to remove all sins; now He has the name above all names!

Jesus' Greatness: ⁵ For to which of the angels did He [God the Father] ever say, "YOU ARE MY SON, TODAY I HAVE BEGOTTEN YOU"? And again, "I WILL BE A FATHER TO HIM AND HE SHALL BE A SON TO ME"? ⁶ And when He [God the Father] again brings the firstborn [that is, Jesus] into the world, He says, "AND LET ALL THE ANGELS OF GOD WORSHIP HIM." // Even though angels are not saved through Jesus, they worship Him; how MUCH MORE should we worship Him!!

HOLY GOSPEL: John 1:1-14 NAU – <u>THE SON OF GOD IN HUMAN FLESH!</u> LET US KEEP RECEIVING HIM!

The Word and Creation: ¹ In the beginning was the Word [the Son of God], and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God [before the creation of the world]. ³ All things came into being through Him [the Son of God], and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being. // Look around... everything in existence was made by the Father through the Son!

<u>Life and Light</u>: ⁴ In <u>Him</u> [the Son of God] was <u>life</u> [the source of physical life and eternal life], and the life was <u>the Light of men</u> [to show them the truth about sin and God's work of salvation]. ⁵ The Light shines in <u>the darkness</u> [the darkness of sin and death], and <u>the darkness</u> did not <u>comprehend</u> [understand it] it. // We do understand; we are so blessed!

<u>John the Baptizer</u>: ⁶ There came a man sent from God, whose name was <u>John</u> [John the Baptizer]. ⁷ He came as a witness, <u>to testify</u> [to tell the truth] about <u>the Light</u> [the Son of God], so that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the Light, but he came to testify about the

Light. // God sent John for that purpose – to tell the truth about Jesus; then, through that truth, the Spirit made them sorry for their sins and gave them faith to trust in Jesus as their Savior!

Unknown to the World: ⁹ There was the true Light [the Son of God] which, coming into the world, enlightens every man [as He spoke God's truth and removed all sins]. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through Him [the Father working through the Son], and the world did not know Him [♠]. // Hmmm... the Son of God made all people, yet most do not know Him. Why? They don't know ♣God's Word, nor ♣His righteous requirement, nor ♣their own great need for God's righteousness. May God, in His mercy, open eyes to see His truth!

Some are Born of God: ¹¹ He came to His own [to His own people, the Jews], and those who were His own did not receive Him. ¹² But as many as received Him [believed in Him], to them He [Jesus] gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name [with their God-given faith], ¹³ who were born, not of blood [physical descent] nor of the will of the flesh [like two people choosing to have a child] nor of the will of man [since no one of himself can choose God], but of God. // By God's power we were born of our mothers; by God's grace we are born of God, thus spiritually alive and restored in our relationship with God through the Christ of Christmas!

The Son of God in Human Flesh: ¹⁴ And the Word [the Son of God] became flesh [in the Virgin Mary], and dwelt among us [for a while, to remove all sins], and we [Peter, James, and John] saw His glory [when He was transfigured], glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace [kindness, undeserved love] and truth [about all that is important for this life and the life to come]. // What is essential? Giant Eagle, Home Depot, Walmart? God uses those stores to bless us with our earthly needs; however, Jesus is MOST ESSENTIAL because we need Him for forgiveness, life, and salvation! Let us keep receiving Him!
