

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today, ▶we are in Mark chapter 10, ▶the cross of Jesus is drawing closer, and ▶Jesus and His disciples are going up to Jerusalem. Jesus was leading them and unafraid, but Jesus' disciples were fearful! Right at that moment, Jesus told them God's plan: ³³ "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and will hand Him over to the Gentiles. ³⁴ They will mock Him and spit on Him, and scourge Him and kill Him, and three days later He will rise again."

Even though Jesus knew the *horror* of what was coming for Him, *He fully obeyed His Father's will!* May the Holy Spirit use this sermon to **\\$grow** our thankfulness for Jesus' saving work and **\\$give** us a heart to rightly serve Him with our lives!

1. Does Jesus Owe Us Something? 35 James and John, the two sons of Zebedee, came up to Jesus, saying, "Teacher,

we want You to do for us whatever we ask of You."

36 And He said to them, "What do you want Me to do for you?"

37 They said to Him, "Grant that we may sit, one on Your right and one on Your left, in Your glory." // James and John tried to lift themselves up to a high position, but Jesus calls us to humble ourselves (Luke 14:11). Consider these passages on the topics of serving and rewards:

- a. <u>Serving</u>: In Luke 17:7-10, Jesus told His disciples that a slave does what he is commanded because he is a slave. Then Jesus said to His disciples, "So you too, when you do all the things which are commanded you, say, 'We are unworthy slaves; we have done only that which we ought to have done."
- b. Rewards: In Mark 10:28-30, Peter said to Jesus, "...we have left everything and followed You." Jesus said, "...[everyone] who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or farms, for My sake and for the gospel's sake, ...will receive a hundred times as much now in the present age...; and in the age to come, eternal life." Jesus owes us nothing, but when we follow Him He freely gives us much!
- 2. What Did Jesus Mean by Drinking and Baptizing? <sup>38</sup> But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" // With both words "drink" and "baptized" Jesus was talking about His suffering. But note this key difference: "drink" is the active tense Jesus willingly followed the Father's will; "Baptized" is the passive tense the Father putting our sins and His wrath on Jesus!

- 3. Who Determines the Positions in Glory? <sup>39</sup> They said to Him, "We are able [to drink the cup you drink and be baptized with the baptism with which you are baptized]." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you shall drink; and you shall be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized. <sup>40</sup> But to sit on My right or on My left, this is not Mine to give; but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." // For James and John, their desire was commendable, but they had more to learn.
  - a. What is the difference between Jesus and His disciples?
    - i. When Jesus drank and was baptized (suffered) He took away our sins!
    - ii. When followers of Jesus drink and are baptized (suffer for Jesus' sake) they publicly confess Jesus!
  - b. <u>Should we exalt ourselves</u>? *No!* The Bible is clear: **Our job** is to *humble ourselves*; **God's job** is to *exalt us*.
  - c. Should we trust that God's plan is best? By all means!
    ▶God loves us, ▶God has brought us into His family through Jesus, ▶God has plans for us now that He wants us to know and follow, and ▶God has plans for us in eternity that He wants us to look forward to!
- 4. Should We be Different than the World? <sup>41</sup> Hearing this, the ten began to feel indignant [angry] with James and John. <sup>42</sup> Calling them to Himself, Jesus said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them; and their great men exercise authority over them. <sup>43</sup> But it is not this way among you, but whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant; <sup>44</sup> and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be slave of all. // It was wrong for James and

John to ask, but it was also wrong for the others to become angry. Jesus then spoke to all of them.

- a. <u>Romans</u>: They were heavy-handed with their subjects to maintain their high positions similar to some USA politicians, who **should** be public servants!
- b. Christians: The opposite of the Romans, and how the USA politicians are supposed to be! Want to be great? Serve others! Want to be greatest? Be the slave of all!
   A great quote from Lenski: "...the great man does not sit atop the lesser men, but the great man bears the lesser men on his back" (462). Jesus is doing that for us having taken our sins and now carrying us to heaven!
- 5. What are Some Key Factors of Jesus Serving Us? <sup>45</sup> "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." // The Son of God put on flesh to serve us. Our need was GREAT and His service was EXCRUCIATING, but Jesus paid our ransom!

## Conclusion:

- Truth Jesus owes us nothing but gives us everything!
- Relevance Our part know and follow God's will; God's part give us a high position in eternity!
- Inspiration As Jesus, the HIGHEST, did the lowest, let us model the service of Jesus in our lives!
