

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Last week I made a comparison between *the 4-stroke internal combustion engine* and *the 5-stroke Christian engine*. These are the basics:

- A 4-stroke engine cycles through these strokes: intake, compression, power, and exhaust.
- A 5-stroke engine cycles through these strokes: Bible, prayer, worship, fellowship, and witnessing.

As the 4-stroke engines in our cars must keep going through the four strokes repeatedly to keep running, so, believers in Jesus are functioning well when they keep moving through the five strokes of the Christian engine.

<u>Last week</u> I introduced the Christian Engine concept and focused on the first stroke, *which is the Bible*; <u>today</u> we focus on the second stroke, *which is prayer*.


- 1. Prayer Survey Results: From last Saturday and Sunday:
 - a. <u>Prayer is talking to God in words and thoughts</u>: That statement is true, *and nearly everyone agreed*.
 - b. <u>Standing, sitting, laying, and kneeling</u>: Most people use many or all those postures when praying. Posture can be important, *but these are more important*:

- i. <u>Trusting in Jesus for eternal life</u>:
 - NAU Proverbs 15:29 "The LORD is far from the wicked, But He hears the prayer of the righteous."
 - NAU John 9:31 "We know that God does not hear sinners; but if anyone is God-fearing and does His will, He hears him."
- ii. <u>Remembering</u>: God is almighty—so He can; God is holy—so He must!
- iii. <u>Believing</u>: God will answer *at His own time* and *in His own way*.
- iv. <u>Truth</u>: NAU Psalm 145:18 "The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth."
- v. <u>Sincerity</u>: Unity between *our mind* and *our heart*.
- vi. <u>Wanting God's Will</u>: As Jesus prayed, "Your will be done" (Mt. 26:42), may that also be our desire in every circumstance!
- c. <u>Why do you pray</u>? Most said, "Yes" to these:
 - i. To give thanks we certainly should!
 - ii. To ask for what I need yes, let us ask!
 - iii. To ask for forgiveness after we confess!
 - iv. To ask for understanding of the Bible Yes!
 - v. To ask for help to do God's will He will help us!
 - vi. To pray for the salvation of others by all means!
- d. <u>Lord's Prayer location</u>: Some knew Mt. 6:9-13—full version or Lk. 11:2-4—abbreviated version; some knew only the book; about half had no answer.
- e. It is possible to pray to God through a saint: Most indicated "F" false; a small number were unsure. This

passage tells us why it is false: NAU **1 Timothy 2:5** "For there is one God, and one mediator also between God and men, the man Christ Jesus..."

- 2. Jesus: He prayed at important times. Here are examples; *I* encourage you to look up and read these passages:
 - a. Luke 3:21-22: After Jesus was baptized, *He prayed, and three amazing things happened!*
 - b. Luke 6:12-16: Jesus prayed all night; then He chose 12 of His disciples to be His apostles.
 - c. Luke 9:18-20: After Jesus prayed, He asked His disciples about Himself; *then Peter made His great confession*.
 - d. Luke 22:39-46: Jesus prayed in Gethsemane, seeking God's will, and His sweat became like drops of blood.
 - e. Luke 23:34, 46: From His cross Jesus prayed, "Father, forgive...," and "Father, into Your hands..."
- 3. Power: Prayer has power; *read these examples*:
 - a. Acts 4:23-31: They were persecuted; then they prayed with boldness; and then the place was shaken!
 - b. Acts 16:25-34: When Paul and Silas were praying in prison, a great earthquake opened all the doors!
 - c. James 5:16-18: Elijah prayed earnestly—*no rain for 3.5 years*; then he prayed again—*it rained*!
- 4. The Christian Engine: See part 1 of the series for a more thorough explanation. Here are some basics: When we are witnessing; then we will Pread the Bible looking for answers, Pray for the person's understanding and protection, and Pinvite the person to worship with us and to attend fellowship opportunities with us.

- 5. Tell, Teach, and Involve: Notice the quote in the image. This is how it applies to this sermon series:
 - a. Tell me is the survey, which introduces the topic.
 - b. **Teach me** is the sermon, which focuses on the topic.



c. Involve me –

are the growth challenges, which I am giving you each week.

Think about life in general, especially the things of God:

- Why hear something if we are just going to forget it?
- Why remember something if we are not going to apply it to our lives?
- Why get involved in something? Because it will become an important part of our lives! <u>Therefore</u>, please see and do what is noted on the Sermon Series Action Information folder!
