

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: This sermon is part 4 of The Christian Engine. So far, we have talked about the importance of **Bible**, **Prayer**, and **Worship** – which become supercharged when we are actively witnessing. Today, we focus on **fellowship** in the Bible, here at Bethlehem, and has part of The Christian Engine.

- 1. Fellowship In the Bible: Fellowship is ⇒a close relationship and ⇒sharing of something in common.
 - a. Fellowship with God:
 - i. God the Father: He ▶ made us through His Son,
 ▶ saved us through His Son, and ▶ is calling all
 people to return to His family through repentance.

 Regarding fellowship with God the Father John
 wrote: NAU 1 John 1:6-7 If we say that we have
 fellowship with Him and yet walk in the darkness,
 we lie and do not practice the truth [that is, our dark
 actions speak louder than our nice-sounding words]; but
 if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light,
 we have fellowship with one another, and the
 blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin." //
 For all who have fellowship with God the Father,

- they ▶trust in Jesus, ▶have been washed clean by the blood of Jesus, and ▶honor Him in their lives (Matt. 5:16)!
- ii. God the Son: He ◆created all things (John 1:3; Col. 1:16), ♦kept OT history moving toward His promised coming (as He appeared many times as the Angel of the LORD), and ♦did everything to take away the sin of the world. Regarding fellowship with God the Son Paul wrote: NAU 1 Corinthians 1:9
 "...you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." // Through our God-given faith, we ♦are in relationship with Him and ♦will finally be in His glorious presence forevermore!
- iii. God the Holy Spirit: He is ▶"the Lord and giver of life" (Nicene Creed) the One through whom the Father worked to give us faith in Jesus, and ▶the One who keeps us trusting in Jesus (Phil. 1:6).

 Regarding fellowship with God the Holy Spirit Paul wrote: NAU 2 Corinthians 13:14 "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all." // When we are in fellowship, that is, close to the HS, then we are ▶in tune with His leading (Gal. 5:16) and ▶walking in His power!
- b. <u>Jesus and His Apostles</u>: As recorded in <u>Luke 22:7-16</u>, Jesus ate the Passover meal with His apostles. *Food and fellowship go together!*
 - i. The meal *commemorated God freeing the Israelites from Egypt and *looked ahead to Jesus, the Ultimate Lamb of God!

- ii. The meal was Jesus' Last Supper, and, during the meal, Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, which is the NT Passover meal!
- c. Fellowship with Other Believers: We have so much in common: Faith in Jesus, membership in God's family, and members of the one body of Christ. What should believers do together? In the early church: NAU Acts 2:42 "They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching [instruction] and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread [the Lord's Supper] and to prayer." // They were devoted to faithfully doing many important things together. Let us do the same!
- 2. Fellowship Here at Bethlehem: Survey results: 36 of 73
 - a. **Mark all the reasons for church fellowship**: 5 options; **26** marked all 5; **10** marked some of the 5.
 - i. Getting acquainted let's grow closer!
 - ii. Giving / Receiving encouragement *living in this fallen world, we all need inspiration!*
 - iii. "Iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another" (Proverbs 27:17 NAU). // As we talk to each other, we learn and benefit from each other!
 - iv. Growing closer as the family of God. // Our God family is our forever family!
 - v. Discovering and praying for each other's needs. // Ask..., share..., commit to pray for each other!
 - b. Which fellowship opportunities do you participate in?
 - i. Sunday Refreshment Time (10:15) = 23
 - ii. Advent and Lent Meals (12 & 6) = 22
 - iii. Easter Breakfast (10:30) = **17**

- iv. Ascension Day Meal (6:00) = 18
- v. Church Picnic (late summer) = 23
- c. If these were offered, which one(s) would you attend?

Video-based study of "The Chosen" on some Wednesdays after Easter:

- i. Fellowship 10:30-11; Study 11 = **13**

- 3. Fellowship As Part of The Christian Engine: When a person is in Christ, he/she will be concerned about the salvation of others – which will lead to witnessing. Then, from witnessing, he/she will act to benefit that person:
 - a. Bible read to find answers!
 - b. **Prayer** pray for understanding and repentance!
 - c. **Worship** invite to attend and grow!
 - d. **Fellowship** *invite to encourage and strengthen!*
