Text: Selections from Genesis 15; Hebrews 11; Luke 12 NAS 1995

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: May this sermon encourage us to <u>▶believe</u> God's promises, <u>▶put</u> our faith into action, and <u>▶have</u> complete trust that cancels all worry!

1. Though the LORD's Promise Seemed Impossible ▶ Abram Believed: Genesis 15:1-6: ...the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, saying, "Do not fear, Abram...; Your reward shall be very great." Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what will You give me, since I am childless...?" ... Then behold, the word of the LORD came to him, saying, "...one... will come forth from your own body, he shall be your heir." And [the LORD] took [Abram] outside and said, "Now look toward the heavens, and count the stars, if you are able to count them." And He said to him, "So shall your descendants be." Then [Abram] believed in the LORD; and [the LORD] reckoned it to [Abram] as righteousness. // Abram was 75 years old and had no children, yet he believed the LORD's promise (Romans 4:20-21), which was fulfilled when he was 100! The LORD has also made many promises to you; do YOU believe?

## 2. Because of Their Faith → They Took Radical Action: Hebrews 11:1-11

- a. ¹ Now <u>faith is</u> the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.... // By our God-given faith, we are certain God will fully keep every promise!
- b. <sup>4</sup> By faith Abel offered to God a better sacrifice than Cain... // What made Abel's offering better? He offered it from his faith, which made it acceptable to God!
- c. <sup>5</sup> By faith Enoch was taken up so that he would not see death... for... he was pleasing to God. <sup>6</sup> And without faith it is impossible to please [God], for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him. // Enoch \*had faith, \*lived by his faith, and \*was pleasing to God!
- d. <sup>7</sup> By faith Noah, being warned by God about things not yet seen, in reverence prepared an ark for the salvation of his household... // God said to Noah, "...the earth is filled with violence...; and behold, I am about to destroy [the people] with the earth. Make for yourself an ark... the length [510 feet, the width 85 feet, and the height 51 feet]" (Gen. 6:13-15). // Destruction! Ark! Sounds impossible, BUT by faith Noah built an ark!
- e. <sup>8</sup> By faith Abraham, when he was called, obeyed by going out to a place which he was to receive for an inheritance; and he went out, not knowing where he was going.... // By faith Abraham, at 75 years old, left the place called Haran (11:31) and traveled to a place the LORD would show him a place unknown to him. It didn't make sense, BUT by faith he obeyed!
- f. <sup>11</sup> By faith even Sarah herself received ability to conceive, even beyond the proper time of life, since

- she considered Him faithful who had promised. // When we have FAITH, it doesn't matter what the promise is, but THE ONE who made the promise!
- g. What should we do? Believing the Bible is God's word, let us read it! Believing the Bible is best for us, let us live it! Believing the HS works through the Bible to transform hearts and lives, let us share it!
- 3. When We Fully Trust → Worry Is Canceled: Luke 12:22-34: <sup>22</sup>...[Jesus] said to His disciples, "For this reason I say to you, do not worry about your life, as to what you will eat; nor for your body, as to what you will put on." // People with faith are at peace, while people without faith worry.
  - a. Why No Worry? <sup>23</sup> "For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing." // Since God has given us life and body, He will certainly give food and clothes!
  - b. Example 1: <sup>24</sup> "Consider the ravens, for they neither sow nor reap; they have no storeroom nor barn, and yet God feeds them; how much more valuable you are than the birds!" // Rejoice! We are so valuable to God!
  - c. <u>Don't Worry</u>: <sup>25</sup> "And which of you by worrying can add a *single* hour to his life's span? <sup>26</sup> If then you cannot do even a very little thing, why do you worry about other matters?" // Average American life: 79 years = 692,040 hours (8760 x 79). One more hour is like a drop in a bucket *BUT worrying cannot add even a single drop!*
  - d. Example 2: <sup>27</sup> "Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil [work] nor spin [as in the cloth-making process]; but I tell you, not even Solomon in all his glory clothed himself like one of these. <sup>28</sup> But if God so clothes the grass in the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is

- thrown into the furnace, how much more will He clothe you? You men of little faith!" // Since God clothes the very temporary grass, He will surely clothe us!
- e. <u>Guidance</u>: <sup>29</sup> "And do not seek what you will eat and what you will drink, and do not keep worrying. <sup>30</sup> For all these things the nations of the world eagerly seek; but your Father knows that you need these things. <sup>31</sup> But seek His kingdom, and these things will be added to you." // **By faith** we keep growing up in God's word confident that He will provide our needs<sup>30</sup>, while the lives of unbelievers are consumed by the needs and pleasures of this fallen and temporary world<sup>30</sup>.
- f. Encouragement: 32 "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has chosen gladly to give you the kingdom." // In comparison to the whole world, the believers are few, a little flock, but eternally blessed!
- g. <u>Guidance</u>: <sup>33</sup> "Sell your possessions and give to charity; make yourselves money belts which do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near nor moth destroys. <sup>34</sup> For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." // What do YOU treasure, cherish, value *temporal things or eternal things*? When the HS prompts you to \*read your Bible, \*pray, \*attend DS and BC, or \*share your faith: what temporal thing is hindering YOU? How is the HS calling you to repent, to start treasuring eternal things?

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, we have heard, and we know, BUT HELP US TO ALSO BELIEVE AND LIVE UNTO YOUR GLORY!
