Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: Today, we are observing All Saints Day – *which can be confusing*, so let me explain:

- I care about what the Bible says, *not what people say*.
- The term, "saints" appears in the NAS Bible 67 times.
- Saints, according to the Bible, are people who "are faithful in Christ Jesus" (Eph. 1:1), which means they believe in Jesus as their Savior. Furthermore, all such people who believe in Him also live for Him.
- What people can rightly be referred to as saints?
 - All who were believing in Jesus when they died and are now with God.
 - All who are living on earth now and believing in Jesus as their Savior and Lord.

- How does a person become a saint? The Holy Spirit works through <u>baptism</u> (Tit. 3:5-7) and <u>God's word</u> (1 Pet. 1:23) to give faith by which a person trusts in Jesus.
- <u>How does a person continue as a saint</u>? As he cooperates with the Holy Spirit by learning and living God's word; then the Holy Spirit keeps him in Christ.
- <u>Do saints in heaven hear and answer our prayers</u>? No;
 two reasons: *Identify Jesus is the one mediator between God and men* (1 Tim. 2:5) and *Identify* to hear and answer a prayer is *a God-thing*, people have no such abilities.

Now, *in the rest of this sermon*, we focus on the Apostles' Creed as we keep asking the question: What Is a Saint?

- A Person Made by God the Father: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. // God the Father designed all things, then He worked through God the Son to create all things (John 1:3) – including you, and me, and the people we love. Which ones are saints? Those with us now who trust in Jesus and those who have died with their trust in Jesus.
- 2. A Person Redeemed by God the Son: And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; The third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
 - a. <u>Who is Jesus</u>? He is God's only Son, ◆sent by God the Father at the appointed time and ◆conceived by the

Holy Spirit in the virgin Mary – which is when the Son of God put on human flesh for our eternal benefit.

- b. <u>What did Jesus do</u>? He lived without sin; then, when Pilate was the Roman governor, Jesus was **†**arrested, **†**condemned, and **†**crucified. Then, while He was hanging between earth and heaven, God the Father crushed Him with ☺our sins and ☺His wrath against our sins. Then Jesus laid down His life.
- c. <u>What happened when He died</u>? His soul and spirit immediately went to paradise, while His body was entombed.
- <u>What happened on Easter Sunday</u>? God the Father raised Jesus to life, *reuniting His body, soul, and spirit*. Then Jesus descended into hell to proclaim His victory over sin and death. Then Jesus showed Himself alive to certain people.
- e. <u>What happened 40 days later</u>? Jesus ascended into heaven and is now ruling over all things for the good of those who are saints (Eph. 1:22-23), who are trusting in Him and living for Him.
- f. What is yet to happen? At the appointed time (Acts 17:30-31), *Jesus will return, *all people will be put back together body, soul, and spirit, and *the final judgment (Rev. 20:11-15) will take place. Jesus will identify ☺who continued to know Him and ☺who went the way of the world. Then, ⇒those who know Him will be welcome into eternal bliss, while ⇒the others will be sent to eternal torment.
 - i. <u>When we know Jesus</u>: Let us live with peace and joy!

- When we think about our loved ones who have died in Jesus: Let us believe they are in paradise, realize the separation is temporary, and look forward to an amazing eternity.
- 3. A Person Made Holy by God the Holy Spirit: I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen. // Those words apply to all who know Jesus:
 - a. They have the indwelling of the Holy Spirit to assure them, guide them, and empower them.
 - b. They are members of the holy Christian Church, which include all saints *both in heaven and on earth*.
 - c. They have received the forgiveness of their sins.
 - d. Their bodies will be raised to life when Jesus returns.
 - e. In their bodies, souls, and spirits, *they will forever enjoy the awesome blessings of our Great God* – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, help us to understand and rejoice that we are saints in Your sight through Jesus. Then, as we remember our loved ones who have died, help us to know they died in Jesus and give us peace. Finally, as we think about others who do not currently know Jesus, help us to share Your life-changing word with them!
