

Introduction: Dear friends in Christ: During this Season of Advent, let's learn how to easily benefit from the Bible through *reading (God's word), *thinking (about the reading), *answering (the questions), and *praying (for application).

Today's Bible readings focus on some **basic teachings** of the Bible; then, *in the weeks ahead*, we will get into:

- OT passages about the coming Messiah.
- Gospel passages about Jesus' identity and birth.
- Epistle passages about the eternal benefits that belong to us through →sorrow for sin and →trust in Jesus.

This sermon will expand on the information in the Advent – Christmas booklet. Please use the booklet every day and bring it with you every time you attend.¹

Day 1 - Sunday, 12/3 - Creation

Read and Think (4000 BC): Genesis 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.... Genesis 1:26 Then God

said, "Let Us make man in <u>Our image</u>, according to <u>Our likeness</u>..." **Genesis 1:31** God saw all that He had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Answer and **Pray**:

- Who created all things and all people? The simple answer is "God." The Hebrew word is Elohim, which is a plural noun – pointing to the Holy Trinity. Elohim appears in Genesis chapter 1 a total of 32 times! The present and common teaching that all things evolved by random chance from a big bang about 13 billion years ago has NO CONNECTION to God's Holy Word.
- How were the people like God? They were made in God's image and likeness.
 - Image: As God has dominion over all, so God gave the people dominion over the living creatures He made.
 - <u>Likeness</u>: As God is holy, can reason, and can exercise free will, so God made holy people who could reason and exercise free will.²
- Over what period of time did God create? Over six days
 since He completed His work on the sixth day. Even
 though many reject a six-day creation, the Bible is clear.
- How does today's content apply to you? Let us believe the Bible – knowing God created and evolution is false.

Day 2 - Monday, 12/4 - Warning, Temptation, Fall

Read and Think (4000 BC): Genesis 2:16-17 The LORD God commanded the man, saying, "From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; but from the tree of the knowledge of

good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you will surely die." ... Genesis 3:1 ... [the serpent] said to the woman, "Indeed, has God said, 'You shall not eat from any tree of the garden'?" ... Genesis 3:6 When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was desirable to make one wise, she took from its fruit and ate; and she gave also to her husband with her, and he ate.

Answer and **Pray**:

- The LORD gave a clear command and definite
 consequence. Adam and Eve were alive physically and
 spiritually. When they sinned, they immediately died
 spiritually and eventually died physically.
- Did the serpent tempt the woman to doubt God's word? Yes! "Indeed, has God said...?" Satan is still doing the same today – tempting people to doubt God's word.
- What are some reasons why the woman ate the forbidden fruit? She put her human reason over the word of God! Her emotions told her: It looks good, I desire it, and it will make me wise – so she ate!
- How does today's content apply to you? God has established many boundaries for us. Within the boundaries we have freedom, but outside the boundaries are consequences. The Holy Spirit is calling us to believe God's word and honor Him with our lives.

Day 3 – Tuesday, 12/5 – Curse, Promise, Victory

Read and Think (4000 BC): Genesis 3:14-15 The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, Cursed are you more than all cattle, And more than every beast of the field; On your belly you will go, And dust you will eat All the days of your life; And [to the devil, the LORD said:] I will put

enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her seed; He shall bruise you on the head, And you shall bruise him on the heel." ... **1 John 3:8** ... The Son of God appeared for this purpose, to destroy the works of the devil.

Answer and **Pray**:

- The serpent permitted Satan to possess him, so the LORD said how the serpent would be cursed, "On your belly you will go..." Then the LORD spoke to Satan about a particular future descendant of the woman.
- Who is the future descendant? Jesus, the Son of God in human flesh, who became the Messiah, the Christ!
- When they fought on Good Friday, who won? Good Friday pitted Satan against Jesus – not a smackdown event, but the Ultimate Battle to Death! Since Jesus was nailed to a cross and in excruciating pain, He appeared to be losing. Then, when Jesus died, Satan appeared to be the winner. BUT Jesus – through His living, suffering, and dying – destroyed "the works of the devil."
- How does today's content apply to you? Keep going in your booklet to better understand Dour HUGE problem of sin, The GREATNESS of Jesus' victory over Satan, and Thow we receive the benefits of Jesus' saving work!

Let Us Pray: Dear Father, like Adam and Eve, we have *been deceived, *doubted Your word, and *fallen into sin countless times. Therefore, **keep** showing us our great need for Jesus and **help** us in the days and weeks ahead to grow in our understanding of and trust in Jesus, the Christ of Christmas!
